Guest Speaker	<p>Claire Dowers-Nichols talked about OHAI – the Oklahoma Healthy Aging Initiative, funded through Dept. of Geriatric Medicine, through the Reynolds Foundation (Las Vegas). Be familiar with health indicators....senior population scoring D’s & F’s OHAI has a 3 pronged approach to improving the quality of life</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Increase geriatricians, set up new clinics, bring in new docs 2. Provide health education to consumers and providers 3. Optimize health & aging policy <p>In each region there will be 3 people...educator, outreach and support & they will partner with a geriatrician. This will include clinical, educational and inter-disciplinary care, possibly a social worker. There will be a core clinic in each regional area. Statewide there will be a senior health network and eventually will add on: caregiver comprehensive training for families and professional caregivers.</p>
